### 1 - TROPICAL TERRACE

Container gardens are a great way to bring life to a patio space. The Grove, where students enjoy lunch, wedding parties congregate, and benefit guests gather is filled with the sky-high foliage of tropical bananas and elephant ears, as well as fiery blooms of petunias, salvia, and celosia spilling out of the containers. These gardens are hot, hot, hot and draw in visitors and hummingbirds alike.

### 2 - TRAILBLAZERS JOURNEY

This garden is beaming with LC Pride. Blue and white flowers spill out of the raised beds and scream. "We are Trailblazers!" School spirit is strong in our community and we love to show it any way we can... especially through flowers.

### 3 - LEGACY LANDSCAPE

Steeped in the history of Monticello College, Fountain Court evokes feelings of repose and continuity from the past to the present. Acting as the centerpiece, the JL Mott Fountain has stood for more than 100 years, having been restored and rededicated in 2016. The decorative planters that surround the fountain complement the 19th century architecture of the college's historic Main Complex, which will soon undergo a major renovation. The aesthetic spaces and buildings establish beauty with purpose; elegance that calls out to be inhabited.

### 4 - HOMEGROWN HABITAT

The Monticello Sculpture Gardens believes in responsible and sustainable gardening practices.
