U of I Transfer Programs Offered to Lewis and Clark Students

Through a partnership with the University of Illinois Urbana-Champaign, students at Lewis and Clark have the unique opportunity to complete their first two years at Lewis and Clark, before transferring on to UIUC to complete a bachelor's degree.

Transfer programs allow students to earn a degree in Natural Resources, Environmental Sciences or in Horticulture through the University's College of Agricultural, Consumer and Environmental Sciences (ACES). Students can also earn a degree in Architecture through UIUC's School of Architecture or a degree in Landscape Architecture through the School of Fine and Applied Arts.

Natural Resources, Environmental Science and Horticulture

The guaranteed transfer agreements between Lewis and Clark and the College of ACES were the first for UIUC. The transfer agreement allows students who have met the necessary transfer admission requirements at Lewis and Clark to automatically transfer with junior standing to UIUC. The agreement between the two institutions guarantees acceptance to the Lewis and Clark student upon completion of their first two years.

A four-year degree in Natural Resources and Environmental Sciences from UIUC gives students multiple career opportunities such as wildlife biologist, restoration ecologist, soil scientist, field biologist, extension education, environmental consultant and conservation biologist.

Architecture and Landscape Architecture

Students interested in a degree in architecture or landscape architecture can design their own future with the transfer agreement between Lewis and Clark and UIUC.

These two transfer programs require students to complete a series of courses at Lewis and Clark in architecture, pre-architecture and general education, as well as necessary coursework in physics and calculus for architecture majors and trigonometry and statistics for landscape architecture majors. A prerequisite of three semesters of foreign language (or three years of foreign language at the high school level) is also required. Courses at Lewis and Clark are designed to be completed in two years of full-time study and lead to another two years of full-time enrollment at UIUC. Students who complete the course of study at Lewis and Clark will receive an A.S. degree. Admission to the School of Architecture and to the Landscape Architecture Program is selective.

Earning a Degree from UIUC at Nearly Half the Cost

Imagine earning a degree from the University of Illinois, and only paying half the cost. That is essentially what you can do if you select to attend Lewis and Clark for the first two years, and then take advantage of the transfer agreements the college has with UIUC.

Former Lewis and Clark students report that the education they received was of high quality and prepared them well for their transfer degree.
