#### 1- Wade Entrance

Responsible and sustainable gardening practices are important to the Monticello Sculpture Gardens. This "native with intention" garden welcomes buses and visitors to campus and is packed with plants, which are native to our local ecosystem and help support pollinators.

### 2 - Fountain Court

Home to the JL Mott Fountain, the gardens of Fountain Court evoke feelings of repose and continuity from the past to the present. The fountain has stood for more than 100 years and was restored and rededicated in 2016. The surrounding gardens are a nod to Victorian era landscapes and complement the 19th century architecture of the college's historic Main Complex.

# 3 - Growing Knowledge Garden

Started from seed, planted and taken care of by College for Life students in a year-round gardening course sponsored by the Lynne F. Solon Foundation, this garden teaches students the benefits of locally grown edibles and how to harvest and prepare them in healthy meals.

### 4 - The Bosque

This discovery garden was designed for interaction and education. The plants contained within these walls are edible, medicinal, heavily scented, or pigmented. This space is used to educate groups on herb drying, botanical dyes, and the benefits of vegetable gardens. Parts of these gardens are tended to by the College for Life gardening class and LC Garden Club.

# 5 - The Living Wall

The ever-favorite Living Wall is home to numerous begonia varieties, tiger stripe ferns, caladiums, and eye-catching shade plants. The pockets, made from recycled plastic water bottles, hang from a wooden backdrop and are filled with soil and planted to create the ultimate selfie spot. # 6 - Hatheway West
