

Admissions Criteria Overview

To ensure a fair and competitive selection process, the following criteria are used to evaluate and rank all applicants. Admission is based on a point system that considers academic performance in each required prerequisite course as well as the general education courses. Applicants must have completed or be currently enrolled in all prerequisite courses listed below. Candidates are reviewed and ranked according to their total score, with the highest-ranking applicants being offered admission first.

This form is available only as a guide to allow student to estimate how they are ranked within application process and explain the criteria. There is no need to contact the Nursing program regarding your potential score. No determination or offers of acceptance will be made until ALL applicants have been reviewed.

Residency Priority

- In-district students are selected first.
- Out-of-district students are considered if space is available.

Section 1: Prerequisite Courses (Max: 76 points)

Grades are assigned number value (A=4, B=3, C=2) and multiplied by credit hours to determine points. A grade of C or higher is required – a grade of D or F is not eligible for consideration. You must have completed or be currently enrolled in each of these courses.

Section 2: GPA

Minimum GPA required: 2.75. Higher GPA breaks ties. If more than one student has the same total score at the end of the admission sheet, the student with the highest GPA will be placed higher.

Section 3: Health Science Experience (Max: 3 points)

Students can earn up to 3 additional points by providing us with verification of other health certifications (exe. CNA or RMA).

Section 4: General Education Courses (Max: 96 points)

Grades are assigned number value (A=4, B=3, C=2, D/F/not taken=0) and multiplied by credit hours to determine points. If you have taken more than one class in a category (exe. PSYC 232 and PSYC 233), the class with the highest grade will be used.
