Send Official Transcripts to the Enrollment Center: High School, GED, & any colleges attended. Entrance Exam: You have to take and pass the TEAS test at Lewis and Clark Community College. Offered in October and April. Register for the test by contacting the Nursing Department. Prerequisite classes do not have to be completed before taking the entrance exam. More can be found on the Nursing website under "Resources" www.lc.edu/nursing. Fill out the card of intent at the TEAS test. It is the student's responsibility to make sure this is updated as necessary. Minimum GPA: You must have a college GPA of 2.75 or higher (cumulative last 5 years). Reside in L&C District No. 536 or East St. Louis Community College Center No. 541: Nonresident applicants will be considered if space is available. Students must have all prerequisites completed by the end of the Fall or Spring term

Admission to the ADN program is selective.

A satisfactory health examination report, drug screening, and criminal background check are required upon admission. The Nursing Program will cover the additional requirements in orientation after you receive an official acceptance letter. Please see the Nursing website for more details www.lc.edu/nursing.

Additional Courses Required for ADN
