


Andy Simpson- Ambassador/Contributor for over 20 years

Letterance McFadden-Men's Basketball, 2000-2001

Letterance McFadden in 2001 was the first Lewis and Clark men's basketball NJCAA All American in school history. During McFadden's sophomore season he scored 672 points for a 21.6 points-per-game average which led his team to 18 wins. His career totals include 1,132 points, 306 rebounds, 221 foul shots made, while shooting 55.5 percent from the field. McFadden was also recognized as an All Conference performer in the MCCAC and CCCI in both his freshman and sophomore years. After graduating from Lewis and Clark McFadden received a full basketball scholarship to attend Augusta State University in Augusta, Georgia.

Darren Starzyk- Men's Soccer, 1988 and 1989

Darren Starzyk is a very unique two time NJCAA All American. He was selected as an offensive All American in 1988 when he scored 10 goals and added 8 assists. He was selected again as an All American in 1989 as a defensive player. His field presence in 1989 led his team to the NJCAA National Tournament. In addition to being named a two- time NJCAA All American Darren was also selected as an NSCAA All American and an All Region performer in both his freshman and sophomore seasons at Lewis and Clark. Darren continued his college soccer career at the University of Missouri-St. Louis and is currently employed with the St. Louis County Police Department.
