



## 2006 Hall of Fame Inductee



### ***Angie Bode***

Angie Bode was a unanimous selection to the Lewis and Clark Community College Athletics Hall of Fame this year.

Graduating in the Spring of 1999, Bode was a member of the 1999 National Championship Team and was named the Most Valuable Player of the national tournament that year. She was also a natural selection as an All-American by both the National Junior College Athletic Association and the National Soccer Coaches Association of America.

As a freshman at Lewis and Clark in 1998, Bode scored 22 goals and 25 assists for 69 points. She was named MVP of Region 24; first team, All-Region 24; first team, All-Central NSCAA; first team, NSCAA; and first team, NJCAA. She was named to the 1999 All Tournament Team and in addition to MVP honors, was also named Most Valuable Forward in the nation.

She is the leading scorer in Lewis and Clark history with a career 62 goals, 41 assists and 165 points. Her team was 42-5-0 during her two years at Lewis and Clark.
